# Meeting called to order at 6:32pm

- Motion to approve the agenda for February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2017. proposed by Bryce Godenir and seconded by Lise Tellier.

#### FrancoSud - Anne-Marie Boucher (absent)

Summary of the meeting of February 14, 2017:

- Extracurricular transportation to Notre-Dame-des-Monts: The NDM Board school has asked the School Board to review the decision to offer extracurricular transportation to recreation centers.
- School transportation survey, there were 818 respondents. Overall, they are satisfied with the services.
   The challenges raised include punctuality, communication of delays and management of problems on the bus.
- Management of pre-Kindergartens, there are 3 schools interested in the School Board managing the nursery school, Beausoleil, La Vérendrye and Le Ruisseau schools. No decision has yet been taken.
- Grade 12 will now be offered at La Source. A grade 10 class has been added to Ecole Beausoleil and Notre-Dame des Vallees has decided not to add grade 9.
- Administrative Guidelines: Healthy Schools and First Nations, Metis and Inuit: Recognition of Territories.
- Resignation of Councilor Oumar Lamana on March 1, 2017.

- The next FrancoSud Council meeting is March 14<sup>th</sup> at Les Cypres school in Medicine Hat and the community consultaion is scheduled for February 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> at La Mosaïque School.
- Visit of the Minister of Education on February 16, 2017 to La Source school
- The three topics requested by the minister: climate change, education law and curriculum renewal.
- The three challenges: infrastructure, transportation and high school.

## Principal's Report – Mme Ginette and Mme Isabelle

- Materials to be prepared before a school council meeting. According to the statutes and regulations, the agenda and the minutes must be sent to the parents 2 weeks before each meeting, the management also specifies that the agenda must be drawn up by the secretary and sent to the management in order to be approved. It is suggested that the documentation be sent on the Monday two weeks prior so that it is forwarded to the parents in the weekly memo on Tuesday. The next meetings are April 5, May 17 and June 14. The deadlines are therefore scheduled for March 20<sup>th</sup>, May 1<sup>st</sup> and May 29<sup>th</sup>.
- Lunch out of school for grade 7,8 and 9 students. The student council has submitted an application to
  allow students in grades 7 9 to go outside the school boundaries at lunch. This opportunity will be
  offered to the students Tuesday to Thursday. Students will not be allowed to go to the Skate Park.
  Students will be required to specify where they will be during the lunch hour. Parents will be notified if
  the student is late and consequences will be the loss of privileges as aggreed apon by student council
  and the school.
- Next year skiing: There would be an opportunity to offer a 2 days of skiing lessons. It is suggested to see if the C.O.P. offers other sports activities or more latitude for students who have much easier to avoid the lack of interest.
- School calendar 2017 2018: Mme Isabelle presented the calendar for the next school year. The school will possibly be closed 3 days earlier than usual. Teachers will need time to prepare for the move to the new school.
- New school: 78 people attended the open house for the new school.

#### Teacher's Report – Ms. Lisa Landry

- Philosophy for students: Ms. Lisa presented the philosophy for students. 'Thinking by and for oneself'.
- Learning to think: creative, rational, critical and attentive. To produce judgments; based on criteria and context.
- How it is done in the classroom: we favor the semicircle, the sharing of ideas, the problematic situations, the collective deepening on their individual perception.
- From experience, Ms Lisa noted that the philosophy is interdisciplinary, it also allows us to see how students respect each other and their ideas. This promotes group communication, empathy, collective problem solving, taking risks and make mistakes, let students think. Ms. Lisa guides the guestioning.
